Dear Laws and Regulations Committee Members,

My name is Greg Krissek and I serve as the CEO of the Kansas Corn Growers Association (KCGA). KCGA represents more than 1,000 members on state and national levels on legislative and regulatory issues and actively works with other organizations to maximize the voice of Kansas corn producers.

I am writing today to express our full support of the proposal submitted by Kristy Moore titled: "Amend Section 2.1.2 of the Uniform Regulations, Section G. Gasoline and Gasoline- Oxygenate blends to reference the U.S. EPA regulatory section on the special provisions for alcohol blends while eliminating the reference to specific ethanol content." We request that you consider approving this proposal for a voting item for the upcoming July meeting. The full details of EPA's nationwide RVP rule will be known prior to July, giving the body adequate time for review.

While the state of Kansas is not directly impacted by the potential conflict with federal regulations that will occur when the pending EPA nationwide RVP rule comes into effect, it is our understanding that many states may have a conflict. KCGA enjoys a great working relationship with the Kansas Department of Agriculture, Division of Weights and Measure and the Program Manager, Doug Musick, who serves on the committee. Mr. Musick has briefed us on the potential conflicts in other states. We determined that these conflicts may hinder E15 sales in some parts of the country during the summer driving season. With depressed commodity and ethanol prices our members are experiencing extreme financial stress and we are supportive of any effort to increase the demand for ethanol.

Therefore, we respectfully ask that you approve Ms. Moore's proposal for a voting item for the July meeting. Thank you for your consideration in this matter.
